Almost 2,000 members register at the 2012 annual meeting

A RECORD NUMBER of 1,988 members registered at Newberry Electric Cooperative’s 72nd Annual Meeting on Wednesday, April 4, at the Newberry High School gymnasium. Each member who registered received a heat-sealed, no-leak cooler tote, along with a pair of double-insulated tumblers. Members enjoyed an array of music from gospel to rock and roll provided by The 3rd Generation Band as they waited for the meeting to begin at 7 p.m.

CEO Keith Avery began his report by informing members of numerous changes that have already taken place at the cooperative under his leadership. He told members that the cooperative is focusing on increased customer service, starting with a new after-hours call service to cut down on members getting busy signals during power outages. He also spoke about the cooperative now having a presence on Facebook and noted that Twitter would soon follow.


Avery told members that they could now email an outage and the email goes to the entire management staff. He also made members aware that a rate study was under way focusing, among other things, on the power cost adjustment. He anticipates completion of the study sometime in May or June of this year. Avery stated, “With new regulations being discussed by the Environmental

Protection Agency (EPA), we have a hard battle in Washington. We will definitely have lots of challenges.”

Newberry Electric’s General Counsel Tom Pope conducted the business portion of the meeting, in which William (Bill) Lominick Sr. (Zone 1), J. Wayne Nichols (Zone 2) and Tobie R. Shealy (Zone 3) were reelected to the Board of Trustees.

Master of Ceremonies Lou Green brought excitement to the evening as he announced the winners of various drawings, including an early bird registration prize of a \$200 electric bill credit. The grand prize winners of the evening, bringing home \$500 electric bill credits, were John Sims and Sarah Byrd. The \$200 electric bill credit went to Thomas Chaplin.
